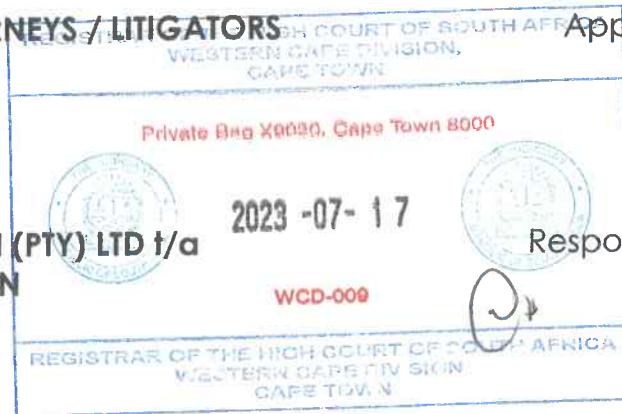

DRAFT ORDER

**HAVING HEARD COUNSEL FOR THE APPLICANT AND HAVING READ THE
PAPERS FILED OF RECORD, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:**

1. That the Respondent is placed under provisional liquidation;
2. That a rule nisi be issued, calling upon the Respondent and all interested parties to show cause, if any, to the above Honourable Court on Tuesday, **15 August 2023**, as to why:

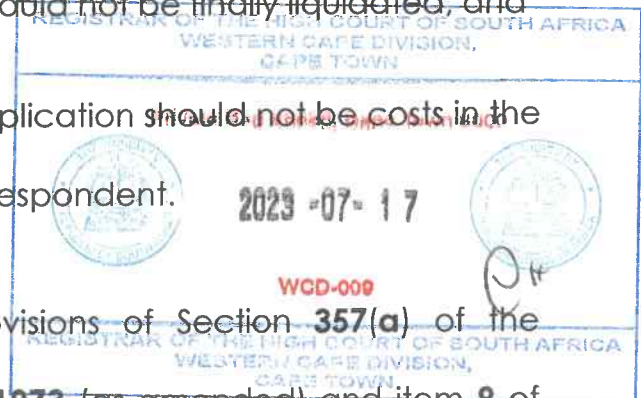
2.1. The Respondent should not be finally liquidated; and

2.2. The costs of this application should not be costs in the liquidation of the Respondent.

3. That, in terms of the provisions of Section **357(a)** of the Companies Act No. 61 of **1973** (as amended) and item **9** of schedule **5** of the Companies Act **71** of **2008**, as read with Section **19** of the **Insolvency Act**:

3.1. The Registrar shall transmit a copy of the winding-up order to the Sheriff of the province in which the registered office of the Respondent is situated and to the Sheriff of every province in which it appears that the Company owns business.

3.2. The Sheriff shall attach all property which appears to belong to the Respondent and shall transmit to the Master an inventory of all property attached by him or



her in terms of Section 19 of the Insolvency Act 24 of 1936.

4. That service and publication of the provisional winding-up order shall be affected as follows:

4.1. Service by the Sheriff on:

4.1.1. the registered office of the Respondent at 48 Sedgemoor Road, Camps Bay CAPE TOWN;

4.1.2. the employees of the Respondent, if any; and

4.1.3. all registered trade unions representing the employees of the Respondent, if any.

4.2. By hand on:

4.2.1. The Master of the High Court, Cape Town; and

4.2.2. The South African Revenue Services.

4.3. By publishing the provisional winding-up order in "Die Burger" and "Cape Times".
